Professes love for you very quickly & seems to quote poems and lyrics along with using their own type of broken language, because they profess their love and devotion quickly. They also showed concern for your health and love for your family. Promises marriage as soon as he/she gets set for leave that they asked you to pay for. They request money (bank transfers) and Amazon, iTunes, Verizon, etc gift cards, for medicine, religious methods, and blades to get home, internet access, complete job assignments, help sick friend, get him out of trouble, or something that sounds fishy. The military provides all soldiers with needs including food medical care and transportation for leave. Believe me, I lived it, you're probably fooled. I'm just trying to show you the example that you're being ripped off with the most time. Below is an email response I received after I sent a request to the U.S. government when I discovered I was I got this wonderful reply back with lots of useful links on how to find and report your scammer. Right now you can also copy the image he gave you and do a google image search and you will hopefully see the pictures of the real person he is impersonating, this doesn't always work and take some digging. If you find the real person you can directly message them and warn them that their image is being used for scamming. Good luck to you and I'm sorry this can happen to you. please continue reading the government reply I received below it is very informative. You have contacted an email that is being monitored by the U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command. Unfortunately, this is a common concern. We assure you that there is never any reason to send money to anyone claiming to be an Online Soldier. If you have only spoken to this person online, it is likely that they are not an American Soldier at all. If this is a suspected scammer's social media profile, we urge you to report it to that platform as soon as possible. Depending on each country and its policies and procedures. Generally, I would be surprised if they scanned and held onto the paper. In the United States, they probably file them some time ago destroying them, perhaps mining them for some data on travelers. In the end, I suspect that paper-to-data capturing the likelihood of customs forms varies somewhere on a spectrum like this: Third World Customs Guy has papers to show he did his job, paper gets thrown out at the end of shift. -----> We keep all the papers! everything is scanned when passing by customs and unique barcodes identify which flight/gate/area form was distributed on, so we coordinate with cameras at the airport and have captured your image. Sure, they've made things worse. However, I believe that relations between the two countries have weakened, probably a better word than has deteriorated, for decades. A window of close relations that is closing How long did Canada have really warm, close relations with the United States? Really, it was a relatively short period from the late 1940s until the early 1960s. The 1950s were a time of economic expansion on both sides of the border, which put people in a good mood. The U.S. seemed to be making Canadians a successful, well-run place, and U.S. investment in Canada was appreciated. In addition, tv came in Canada. The US was putting out some very fun products. I remember it and I think it produced a sense of proximity to the United States that really didn't exist. At the time the US was in an unprecedented new period of international leadership, in defence and the world economy. More typically, however, the US international stance has been isolationist and xenophobic. Canadians, and others, wanted to believe that the United States had turned a new leaf. It didn't. It was a hiatus, both for the United States as a country and for individual Americans. The concept of American uniqueness, of American exceptionalism, is very, very fundamental to Americans. It's part of the personal self-esteem of Americans, not just a political stance. The United States is a mass society with a very large population and a very powerful elite. The feeling of being a unique person in the world, an American, is a powerful bulwark against just being a face in the crowd. A country is a bit like a living cell. It needs a membrane to define its existence. Countries that form close associations with other countries are jeopardizing part of that membrane in favor of having a common outer perimeter. It is like the acceptance of an outer shell as a substitute. This will always be very difficult to do, but it can happen when countries feel ethnic proximity, a strong common cultural heritage (Europe) or conditions where economic trade unions with other countries are so strongly beneficial to so much of the population that their value cannot be denied. The United States has never had these overwhelming factors. When the United States Constitution was adopted, the United States ceased to be British. The United States became a multiethnic, multiracial country, looking for an all-American national identity, brought together by constitutional principles and a massive internal market. I believe that the last few decades have consisted of the United States reverting to its much more traditional isolationist and xenophobic stance. Donald Trump knows how to use it, but he didn't create it. There is far from enough popular demand in the United States to support a special relationship with any country. We were warned Vietnam and race riots did little to destroy positive Canadian sentiment about the United States. Then there were dubious wars, more political and military lies and more pretty poor quality presidents. I really think, around 1970, the era of large-scale Canadian admiration of general American culture was over. However, there was still a great deal of respect in Canada, and other countries, for American leadership. It still stretched, to a limited extent, to Americans as individuals. Canadians were warned by some politicians and ideologues within Canada that it could not last forever. The NDP spoke out, and so did the Left Wing of the Liberal Party. Many Canadians stopped believing what the Americans told us. Some of them began to see their economic dominance in Canada as very damaging and their international judgment as seriously flawed. In a limited way, even our own politicians and journalists began to act out. We maintained relations with Cuba. We improved our relations with China. began to refuse to participate in most of America's wars. We We We their almost desperate clings to very conservative lifestyles and behaviors. For a long time, we were allowed to fly under America's radar. Typically the American attitude towards Canada has been benign neglect. Canada was seen as rather insignificant and generally docile. But slowly, slowly, some Americans began to notice that many Canadians had lost confidence in American leadership, found some favored American lifestyle behaviors rather eccentric and bizarre, and no longer had the same admiration for American culture. The masses of Americans, however, did not notice Canada at all. Donald Trump makes them notice us. He does it for his own purposes and possibly because of his wounded ego. He is dragging Canada into the internal American political debate. This will be nothing short of what's left of the special Canada-U.S. relationship. The relationship was not profitable in the long term. It was based on the lack of interest of docile working-class Americans about the rest of the world, and Canada's low profile, despite the intensity of trade between the two countries. I don't think Canada can go back to the old picture, a harmless, frozen place that showed American superiority, presented no threat, and certainly wasn't worth much attention. Donald Trump is crass and vulgar but Canadians would do well to look at Bernie Sanders' website. His approach to NAFTA is not so much different. If he was twenty years younger and actually got to be president, he would also try to dismantle this working-class base. Canadians tend to empathize with him, but if you look through the lovable, caring image, you can see isolationism leaking out. The next U.S. president might be more polite. There may be nice, smiley photo-ops with whoever happens to be the Prime Minister of Canada. That president may be more cognitive about the reality of U.S. international trade, but there will be no more special relationships. The United States will continue to withdraw after an internationalist period that many Americans never wanted. As much as I hate to agree with Donald Trump about anything, U.S. trade relations with China have been mismanaged and hurt some U.S. industries and workers very badly. The United States has gone through a series of horribly costly international military interventions that have yielded limited results. They have failed to secure their own southern border. The U.S. is in wound-licking mode. It will last for a long time. This is an internal domestic process in the United States that Canadians can't do anything about. My prediction is that the U.S. will come out of it but do by reverting to its traditional stance, making the world go away. As younger generations of Canadians come up, they don't remember that old, nice America. But, we're not passive victims Canada has had its own internal processes. It's Canada's great right. But America is not positive. Canada has developed a which I would call the developing countries friendly and respectful. We see ourselves as credible peacekeepers, peacemakers, interveners and participants in intercultural dialogue in good faith. Much of our immigration is from countries many Americans have been socialized not to like. We reach out to China and India, albeit with some big mistakes. To the extent they know about it, large parts of America will not accept this. Successive Canadian governments, supported by most of Canada's elites and much of the general population, have spent years creating a Social Democratic Canada. Basically, we want to be in a position to sit down with the UK, the Netherlands, Germany and Sweden and compare social programme notes. So many Americans cannot understand this kind of behavior as acceptable in a free country. They can start to see it as conspiratorial. When they find out we're doing it, they're going to distrust us. Canada's economy relies heavily on US markets, but we are moving in a different direction. Recently Canada's population crossed the 37 million mark. It is still growing at a historically rapid pace. It doesn't look like it's going to be long until we reach 40,000,000. We can see internal markets grow. We are gradually getting more of a basis for import substitution. Canada will not adhere to any of the economic demands that the United States imposes on us and has made on us, even before the Trump era. Marketing boards will not go. We will not sell our forest resources to private companies. They will remain Crown land and our softwood lumber will remain on a stump basis. Canada will continue to struggle to get its oil to Canadian ports, divert the flow from the United States and get a better price overseas. We will not accept the legitimacy of buying American politics. If we advocate freer movement of labour, the American answer will be a flat, no. Even if NAFTA survives, trade relations with the United States will have serious sources of friction, just as the United States is giving up its leadership in international trade. Canada will continue to subsidize certain industries, just as the US does. Canadian governments will continue to search for multilateral overseas free trade agreements. The threats from the Trump administration have done what nothing else can do, forcing Canadian manufacturers to look for foreign trade and non-U.S. sources of supply. The Government of Canada will have no choice but to lower tariffs on countries that produce things that we can replace, rather than American supplies, and we cannot produce ourselves. No More Special America We can't afford to defer to American leadership anymore because the U.S. doesn't want to be a leader. This is consistent with their long-term historical stance and the psychological needs of many Americans. Our special relationship with the US was based on their to lead. U.S. will continue to decline and look at other countries only in terms terms of terms what they imagine to be their own interests. They may see a lot of countries negatively but they won't want to see anything very positive and won't tolerate special relationships. And that's their right. It's not a dissenting stance that Canada should waste time decrying. Move On Courtesy by Donald Trump, a large portion of Canada's population has begun to accept what some of Canada's better economists have been saying for years. The United States is not a pillow under our economic feet. We're not going to have special relationships with anyone. (Even after Brexit, the UK will not take us back.) Currently Canada seems to be going through a period of denial, other than anger, then grief, then resignation, much like a bad divorce. When our media commentators and politicians settle down, our governments can make a national business plan, do some sales work and Canadians can learn more about how to buy good stuff from lots of different places.
